### Παλμύρα

Ο καθεστωτικός στρατός στη Συρία έχει εκδιώξει τους τζιχαντιστές της ISIS από μεγάλο τμήμα της Παλμύρας, την οποία είχαν καταλάβει από τον περασμένο Μάιο. Η προέλαση των κυβερνητικών δυνάμεων άνοιξε το δρόμο και για τους «ενσωματωμένους» φωτογράφους, που έδωσαν τις πρώτες εικόνες από τον αρχαιολογικό χώρο -μνημεία του οποίου είχαν καταστρέψει οι τζιχαντιστές.
